We are writing to you now to make you aware of an opportunity that ISA and the [Canadian Political Science Association \(CPSA\)](#) have collaboratively developed for scholars affected by the EO. Since you were unable to come to Baltimore, CPSA, working with their partner ISA Canada, is graciously offering the opportunity to propose the same abstract accepted for the Baltimore ISA conference for presentation at the upcoming annual conference of the CPSA.

The [2017 CPSA Conference will be held at Ryerson University in Toronto from May 30 to June 1](#), and is held together with the Canadian Congress of the Humanities and Social Sciences "*The Next 150*." Paper proposals will be reviewed by the joint CPSA-ISA Canada International Relations section of the CPSA Committee Programme.

While we cannot guarantee a place on that program, we hope to provide as many affected scholars as possible the opportunity for interaction at the CPSA meetings in Toronto.

If you wish to propose your previously accepted paper abstract, you will need to do so by **Friday, March 24th, 2017**. We realize that this is a very tight timeframe, but CPSA must work very quickly to assure adequate space in Toronto in a little over two months.
