SPECIAL BULLETIN ISSUE

This issue of the Bulletin contains a special section on "Theses in Canadian Political Studies". The CPSA published a volume entitled Theses in Canadian Political Studies in 1970 and has since published three annual updatings to the original book. The Board of Directors has decided to publish the updatings once every two years rather than annually. Therefore, the next updating will appear in the spring of 1976, the last one having been published in the spring of 1974. It was also agreed to publish a list of "theses completed" and one of "new theses begun" in the Bulletin the year in which the official updating is not published. The decision to publish the updatings bi-annually was taken because of the substantial amounts of time and money involved in an annual publication and also because it was felt that a bi-annual publication would be sufficient.

One of the main objectives of the theses listing was to minimize research duplication and publicize the availability of research results as rapidly as possible. We trust this new approach will not hamper these objectives in any way.

NUMERO SPECIAL DU BULLETIN

Ce numéro du Bulletin inclue une section spéciale sur "Les thèses en études politique canadienne". L'ACSP a publié, en 1970, un volume intitulé, Thèses en Etudes politiques canadiennes et depuis ce temps l'Association a publié trois suppléments annuels. Le bureau de direction vient de décider de publier le supplément une fois tous les deux ans plutôt qu'annuellement. Pour cette raison le prochain supplément sortira au printemps de 1976, étant donné que le dernier supplément est sorti en 1974. On a, aussi, décidé de publier une liste des "thèses achevées" et de "thèses commencées" dans le Bulletin chaque année où la publication ne paraît pas. La publication est devenue bi-annuelle à cause du coût élevé, et en temps et en argent. En plus l'ACSP a considéré qu'une publication bi-annuelle serait suffisante.

L'objectif principal de cette publication est de permettre une meilleure communication entre les chercheurs en études politiques canadiennes, afin d'aider à la rationalisation des efforts de recherche. Nous espérons que cette nouvelle forme de publication ne ralentira pas la réalisation de cet objectif.

In an effort to promote public interest in Political Science and to encourage potential students to consider the discipline as a major career area the Department of Political Science at the University of Windsor has undertaken two projects.

First, the Department is sponsoring a Symposium on March 14th titled "Politics and the Media". The Symposium is designed to introduce editors and writers (key personnel) from High School newspapers and yearbooks to the joint advantages of studies in Politics and Communication Arts. Over 100 selected students have Press Gallery work, and workshops on news editing, writing and radio and T.V. production in public affairs and politics. The Symposium also ties in with another project undertaken in a similar vein, and that is,

Second, an International Editorial Cartoon Festival running in the Library Gallery, University of Windsor, from March 10th to 20th. The Cartoon festival focuses upon three areas: Watergate; the 1974 Canadian Federal Election; and, Inflation. There are also a few select caricaturizations included of major politicians from Canada and the U.S.A. The festival features over 100 original cartoons and sketches produced by 28 major editorial artists. Again, it is hoped that by attracting the public to such a show the interests of discipline will be better served.

Dr. Lloyd Brown-John's book, Multilateral Sanctions in International Law: A Comparative Analysis, was published by Praeger Publishers in New York in January.

In Memorium

Walter L. White

Walter L. White, Dean of Social Science and Professor of Political Science, died suddenly in Windsor, Ontario, on February 3, 1975. He was fifty-three years of age and had been a member of the Assumption University and University of Windsor faculty since 1956.

Professor White's passing constitutes a major loss to the profession, particularly to those who had the good fortune to share his company over the years. For us, in particular, Walter typified those attributes we try so hard to cultivate: scholar, teacher, and humanist. His academic training involved an Honours B.A. from the University of Western Ontario (1951), an M.A. Degree from the University of Toronto (1952), and a Ph.D. from the University of Michigan (1965). As one of Canada's recognized political scientists Professor White authored and co-authored numerous publications in the Dalhousie Review, Queen's Quarterly, Canadian Public Administration, Canadian Forum, and the Canadian Journal of Political Science. In addition to numerous articles, he co-authored two recent books dealing with Canadian politics, namely, Policy, Politics and the Treasury Board in Canadian Government and Introduction to Canadian Politics and Government.

Professor White, however, was not content with addressing his energies to the scholarly dimensions of the profession alone, for he was also active within the University and the community. He served as the first Head of the Department of Political Science from 1965-70 and was only recently elected the first Dean of Social Science at the University of Windsor, a testimony to the high regard in which he was held by his colleagues. Beyond the University, Professor White served as a consultant to the Windsor City Council, the Windsor Branch of the Ontario Secondary School Teachers' Federation, and as an Advisor to the President of Zambia in 1966.

Walter's tragic loss has daily significance for his colleagues and students for, perhaps more than anything else, his humanist concerns constantly reminded us that the study of politics is important only in so far as it affects the meaning of life. His dedication to learning, devotion to students, and examples to colleagues and friends, made all of us a little better off.



INTERNATIONAL SOCIAL SCIENCE COUNCIL:

OUTLINE OF PROGRAMME 1975-76.

The International Social Science Council convened an Extraordinary General Assembly in June, 1974, to draw up plans for the biennium 1975-76 and to design a programme of joint activities across all the major disciplines.

The General Assembly agreed to continue the activities already in progress under four Standing Committees and then proceeded to launch a joint programme for 1975-76 made up of four priority projects.

STANDING COMMITTEES

The Council has for some years operated a system of Standing Committees. These are entrusted with the planning and execution of projects in important sectors of interdisciplinary co-operation.

1) Social Science Data

The oldest of these Committees focuses on the development of infrastructure services for international social science: this is the Standing Committee on Social Science Data. It has organized over the years a great number of studies, inventories, workshops and conferences on data archives, on computer services, on program packages: a recent example of its endeavours is the highly successful Workshop on Textual Analysis held in Pisa in September, 1974.

2) Comparative Research

Another Committee with a long record of meetings, training courses and joint publications is the Standing Committee on Comparative Research. This has focused on the methodology of cross-national research and has organized a series of Summer Schools for training in comparative analysis: this innovative experiment in computer-assisted methodology training was financed through a generous grant from the Volkswagen Foundation but was also supported by UNESCO through fellowships for students from Eastern Europe and the Third World.

3) Environment

A third Standing Committee was recently established in the field of Environmental Problems: this will organize, with the Science Council of Japan, a major international conference in 1975.

4) Co-operation with National Councils

The fourth Standing Committee has been entrusted with a much broader organizational task: this is the Committee on Co-operation with National Councils. This body promises to become an important bridge-building organization between national and international agencies: it will serve as a forum for discussions of problems of social science policy and for the design of joint projects. The Committee is actively preparing a General Conference of Social Science Research Councils to be held in the autumn of 1975: this will focus on policies pursued in the funding and organization of large-scale projects of research and will also discuss the development of various types of infrastructure services and advanced training courses for research workers. The Committee has paid particular attention to the needs of developing countries in this field: it will work closely with existing Social Science Research Councils in Latin America, Asia and Africa and will help forward the development of further national bodies of this type. It is therefore most interested in collaborating with UNESCO in its efforts to develop regional co-operation among such bodies.

JOINT PROGRAMME

In addition to these activities under Standing Committees, the Council sponsors a broad-gauged joint programme under the Chairmanship of Professor Candido MENDES of Brazil.

The first project under this programme calls for the establishment of a Group of Twenty: this will be a group of internationally established scholars recruited from all the disciplines of the social sciences who will meet at least once every two years for intensive colloquia to review the major issues affecting mankind and offer judgments on priority plans for international research and action. This Group will be established during 1975 and will meet for a first Colloquium on Man's Social Condition in April, 1976.

The second project focuses on World Models: Images of Society and of Man. This will take the form of a series of studies and encounters on the basic assumptions, the data bases and the policy implications of a wide variety of computer models of the interconnectedness of major variables of development: the original M.I.T. model, the MESAROVIC-PESTEL model, the Bariloche, Sussex and Amsterdam models. The thrust of this programme is to bring a broader spectrum of social science knowledge to bear on the evaluation of such models, on the design of new departures and on the organization of time series data for use in the testing of models. In this way the ISSC hopes to create a forum for critical discussion of issues raised at the technical level at the Symposia on Global Modelling already launched by the International Institute of Applied Systems Analysis in Laxenburg. A first workshop in this series is planned in co-operation with Brazilian authorities.

The third project will focus on Man's Urban Setting at the Turn of the Century: Networks and Ways of Life. This calls for studies, seminars and, possibly, even training workshops on the analysis of processes of urbanization and their impact on human life. The project will seek to link up the contributions of geographers and regional scientists to those of other social sciences and will quite particularly consider the possibilities of designing models of

"urban systems" as tools of policy-making in developing countries. The first conference in this series is again likely to take place in Latin America.

The fourth project has close affinities with the tasks of the fourth of the Standing Committees: it calls for concerted action for the World Development of the Social Sciences. The task is to take stock of the differences in resources, personnel and institutional infrastructures across the major world regions and to study ways of integration scholars from the less developed countries into the circuits established in the advanced countries. The project calls for a wide range of initiatives designed to advance the "globalization of the sciences of man and society": to place the resources of world scholarship at the service of the developing countries. The project will be designed in close co-operation with National Councils as well as with UNESCO and will be developed in further depth on the basis of discussions at the General Conference of National Councils in the autumn of 1975. One concrete objective will be to collect and to systematize information for a campaign for contributions to the Regional Equalization Fund advocated by the ISSC: requests for support of this Fund will go to the UNDP and the World Bank as well as to a number of national development agencies and organizations for social science policy.

The ISSC has gone through a major phase of change over the last few years: it has restructured its constitution, it has developed a large network of committees and contacts across all the disciplines and fields of specialization, and it has designed the broad contours of a new programme of global action. These are bold steps in a difficult field of intellectual co-operation: they will not lead far, however, without active support from UNESCO and other UN agencies, from National Councils, and last but not least, from the wider community of scholars in the social sciences.
